King George Schools Code of Conduct Rule 6:

Students will not either individually or as a group harass or intimidate others. Bullying behavior includes but is not limited to physical, verbal, or electronic (“cyber”) intimidation, name calling, taunting, and insults / inflammatory comments and any combination of those activities. Bullying is one form of aggressive behavior that happens in school homes, and communities. Bullies are defined by the behavior they show, not by their size, age or status.

Myths about bullying: (Things that are NOT true)

- Bullying is a normal part of growing up – “just teasing”
- Some people are born bullies, others are born victims
- Bullies are usually social outcasts; Victims are usually weak or weird
- Ignore a bully and they will leave you alone

What parents can do to help :

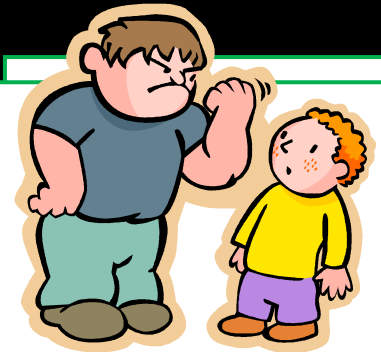
- Talk with your child and work with the school to find a solution.
- Document on-going incidents.
- Help your child develop strategies for handling bullies and rehearse them with him/her
- Share your concerns with a counselor , administrator
